CANDIDATES SOUGHT FOR ENDERLIN AREA SCHOOL BOARD

The Enderlin Area School District #24 will hold its annual election on Tuesday, June 12, 2018 for the purpose of electing one rural member to the Enderlin Area School Board for a three-year term. The Board vacancy is caused by the expiration of the term of office of rural Board Member Lauren Lemnus. In addition to the Enderlin rural area, the communities of Sheldon, Alice and Nome are considered rural. The election will be held in the lobby of the new school addition with the polls opening at 9 a.m. CDT and closing at 7 p.m. CDT.

Lemnus was first elected to the Enderlin School Board in 2015. Lauren Lemnus is seeking re-election.

Any person wishing to be a candidate for this position on the Board must be a qualified elector of the school district, reside within the area they wish to represent, and file a statement with the business manager of the school district before 4 p.m. CDT on the sixtieth day before the election stating their name and the position for which they are a candidate. The candidate will also be required to complete a Statement of Interest form. The last date for filing for this year's election is 4 p.m. CDT on Monday, April 9th. A statement which is mailed must also be in the business manager's possession before 4 p.m. CDT on April 9th, 2018. Both forms are available at the school from District Business Manager Tammy Boeder.

A qualified elector is a citizen of the U.S. who is 18 years old or older and has lived in the district at least 30 days prior to the election. Qualified electors who so desire may also obtain applications for absentee ballots from the district business manager. By law, absentee ballots **cannot** be issued on Election Day.

Juniors Taking the ACT Test

The Juniors will be taking the ACT test on Tuesday, March 20, 2018 at 7:50am in the Enderlin Area School. All Juniors are required under North Dakota law to take this test. The test will be free of charge to the student. Makeup testing will be held April 24, 2018.

The ACT test assesses a student's general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work. It covers four skill areas including English, Mathematics, Reading and Science. The test also includes a Writing portion. The ACT Test is required for college admission at North Dakota four-year schools and at most two-year schools.



The ACT test taken during a student's senior year will cost the student about \$46.00 or more. With the writing part, the ACT test will cost about \$62.50 or more. **It is highly recommend a student take the ACT test more than one time.**

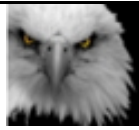
