4th Graders are Stepping it Up

The Fourth Graders are still getting used to a lot of new things that they didn't have before in the lower grades. One new thing for us is textbooks and notebooks. The textbooks are big, take up a lot of room, and we have to transfer our work onto notebook paper! At the end of each day we have 20 minutes of work time, and the kiddos have learned to try to get the textbook work done first, so they don't have to carry many home.

Everyday they are in charge of keeping track of what they have done using their planner and folder. By the end of the day they need to have it all filled in and know what they need to bring home. It's a lot to remember, fourth grade is definitely a year to put their independence into practice!

In math, Miss Finger received a grant for a special program that allows the students to practice their math facts. They have to login three times a week on the i-pads and practice through games to increase their fact memory. The kids are supposed to have addition, subtraction, basic multiplication, and basic division mastered when they enter fourth grade. The program really helps support this and the kids love it! Science, Social Studies, and ND studies are taught daily in fourth grade. In all of them, the students read and discuss. The difficult part is the review

work that has them go back and find answers in the reading.

In science they have STEM Friday. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. The students are given a task and work in groups with materials to try to figure out the solution. For example, they built macaroni cars that had to have wheels that would work. They also made catapults and used candy pumpkins to see how far they could get them to launch.

Every week we read a Studies Weekly about North Dakota. To begin with, we've done quite a bit of map work. We made North Dakota maps, labeled the fifty states on a US map, and the 5 regions. We have been doing novel studies in Reading. We get into three groups to read. We've read books like The Chocolate Touch, The Witches, and now Charlotte's Web. Along with the books, we do character studies and other activities. It's fun to read these bigger books!

In the third grade we had middle school students that came and read with us. This year we are adopting the kindergarten class and plan to read with them twice a month. The purpose of partner reading with them will be for our students to model good oral reading and to give them practice reading as well. We are very excited to start!!

Emergency Substitute Teaching License

Athletic Update

The winter athletic season is upon us and will be in full swing soon! Boys' basketball started up on 11/26 for the high school, with girls' JH and High School basketball already in full swing.

The varsity girls' basketball team is picked 4th out of 13 in Region 1 by the coaches heading into this season and have received the #1 seed for the Barnes County Tournament which is December 4th, 6th and 8th.

The boys' varsity basketball team is picked 3rd out of 13 in the pre-season coaches poll and ranked #19 in the state. There are 109 Class B basketball teams on the girls and boys side.

The boys' and girls' basketball teams will play in the Barnes County Tournament, 12 regular season Region 1 games, 2 games in Jamestown over the holiday break and 3 non-conference games to round out their 20 game regular season. Girls region first round is at home sites and the top 8 qualify for the Region 1 tournament at NDSCS. The boys have the same format with the final 8 going to the SHAC in Fargo.

JH girls will play a 10 game schedule with the 8th graders being invited to play high school once their season is done.
